After graduating with honours from the Royal Veterinary College (RVC), University of London in 2008, Colin went on to gain a first class honours degree in Immunology and Oncology from Kings College and subsequently undertook a one year rotating internship and three year residency in neurology and neurosurgery at the Royal Veterinary College, which was combined with a PhD programme at the University of Ghent, Belgium.

He was awarded the diploma of the European College of Veterinary Neurology by examination in 2012, and became a veterinary neurology specialist. He spent a further eighteen months at the Royal Veterinary College on the neurology faculty before working in private referral practice in Hampshire for a year.

He successfully defended his PhD thesis, entitled 'New insights into the pathogenesis of Syringomyelia in dogs', in May 2014. Colin joined the neurology team at Fitzpatrick Referrals in October 2014

Colin is particularly interested in the diagnosis and treatment of canine Syringomyelia. Colin's other interests include canine epilepsy, novel neuroradiology techniques and neuro-oncology (the diagnosis and treatment of cancers affecting the nervous system).
