Mr. Daniel Chan qualified from University College, Dublin in 1982. He obtained all his post graduate Orthopaedic training in UK, with the exception of one of his Spinal Fellowships, which was in Duchess of Ken Children's Hospital in Hong Kong. He obtained training through the Royal Orthopaedic Hospital programme at Registrar level and the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital programme in Oswestry at Senior Registrar level. He completed two Fellowships in Spinal Surgery, one in Hong Kong and one in St. James' Hospital in Leeds.

He was appointed as Consultant to the Princess Elizabeth Orthopaedic Centre at the Royal Devon and Exeter Hospital in 1996 and had been practicing full time spinal surgery since.

His spinal practice spans all pathologies, with the exception of intradural pathology. Work ranges from microsurgery to the lumbar and cervical spine to complex reconstruction surgery for tumours, fractures, and degenerative conditions. He has a special interest in anterior spinal surgery also has a spinal deformity correction practice.
