Kim Edwards is a senior educationalist and epidemiologist (Associate Professor) in Academic Orthopaedics, Trauma and Sports Medicine, University of Nottingham. She is Deputy Director of postgraduate education for the School of Medicine and Course Director for clinical and non-clinical Sports and Exercise Medicine postgraduate programmes. Her teaching focuses on Research Methods and Statistics for postgraduate medics and other health care professionals. The main focus of her discipline research is physical activity, diet and environmental exposures and their association with chronic disease, such as osteoarthritis, cancer and obesity, from a public health and/or spatial epidemiology perspective. She also develops and test small area estimation techniques, largely for modelling health data and undertakes Medical Education research. Prior to academia Dr Edwards worked in Corporate Banking (leveraged debt finance) in London for twelve years for various banks, culminating as a vice president for JPMorgan Chase Bank. This gives her a wide and diverse set of skills to draw on for research and teaching.
